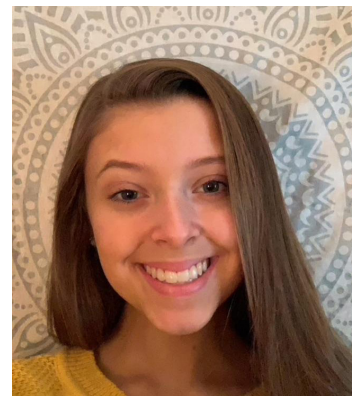

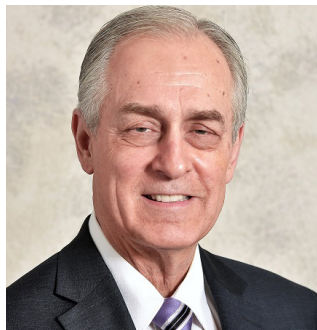

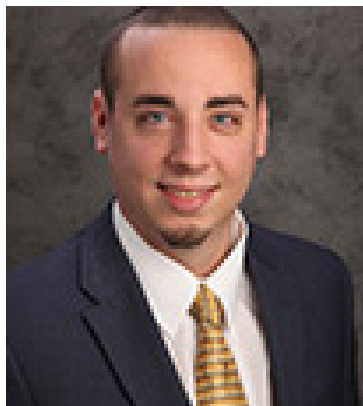

Unadilla Woman Receives National Award

Patricia "Pat" Greene of Unadilla has received the prestigious Jennie Award from the General Federation of Women's Clubs. Pat is one of eight women nationwide to receive this honor.

The GFWC Jennie Award is the only national award recognizing individual members for personal excellence. One club member from each region, of which there are eight throughout the country, is honored biannually for outstanding commitment to her club, community and family. The award is named for GFWC founder, Jane Cunningham Croly, known in the national newspapers for which she wrote as "Jennie June."

The Jennie Award is described as "an occasion to highlight extraordinary club women who epitomize a spirit of independence, courage and persistence in purpose throughout their roles as volunteers within their clubs, elsewhere in the community and as members of a family or extended family."

The GFWC is the largest volunteer organization in all 50 states and many foreign countries. Its members are dedicated to community improvement by enhancing the lives of others through volunteer services. Pat has been involved for more than 50 years, beginning as a member of the now-disbanded Unadilla Women's Club. Pat is active as president of the Central District Emeritus Club and state historian.

Nominees for the Jennie Award are chosen by club members to compete at state level, then forwarded to the regional level and finally the national level, where they can then be chosen for the federation's highest honor.
