Sidney Memorial Veterans Park—a Huge Success

According to Brigadier General James W. McIntyre, U. S. Air Force (Retired) and President of the Sidney Veterans Memorial Park Association (SVMPA); and, from all other accounts and every perspective, the new Sidney Veterans Memorial Park is a huge success for the community and “must see” attraction for area visitors.

Hailed as one of the most beautiful and thought-provoking veteran parks in the northeast, the Sidney Central School Alumni Association (SCSAA) and our membership played a major role in making it possible. Alumni member donations and a \$10,000 matching grant from SCSAA totaling more than \$40,000 essentially paid for the flag house entrance with its grand Sidney Alumni Memorial Wall and freestanding Alumni Veterans Monument (AVM).

The Dedication Ceremony for the uniquely designed park which took place last Memorial Day weekend, exactly five years to the day after groundbreaking, attracted a crowd of well over 2,000 people and was covered by area newspapers and television stations. Two area retired teachers who have made visiting veteran memorials in Hawaii and the northeast one of their favorite pastimes, said of the park, “It is by far

one of the most beautiful and unique we've seen and is arguably the best in the northeastern U.S.!" Another said, "...could easily be located in any major American city!"

The Dedication Ceremony's Keynote Address was made by Brigadier General Peter Palmer, U. S. Army (Retired) and a 1972 SCHS alumnus.

A thoughtful and inspiring address, General Palmer emphasized the uniqueness of the park and that it not only memorializes and recognizes those veterans who have made the ultimate sacrifice or passed, but also those living; and, is much more than just a name on a wall or monument.

Opening remarks were made by Brigadier General James W. McIntyre, U. S. Air Force (Retired) and SVMPA President, as well as, Congressman Chris Gibson, U. S. House of Representatives for New York's 19th District; Assemblyman Clifford W. Crouch, New York State District 22; Mayor Andy Matviak, Sidney; and R. Douglas Sheldon, SCSAA President. The Program was emceed by Chief Petty Officer (FMF) Dick Germond, U. S. Navy (Retired).

Highlights of the ceremony included Posting of the Colors by the crack NYS Police Troop C Color Guard and playing of the National Anthem by the Sidney CSD and Sidney Community Band contingent. Also, the Posting of the Service Flags by members of the Sidney American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars; the Invocation by Steve

Anderson, U. S. Army veteran and SVMPA Charter Member; the bands' medley, "Armed Force's on Parade"; the Ribbon

Cutting by SVMPA members; a Wreath Laying at the Stars of Our Flag Monument and Memorial by Lieutenant Colonel Paul Beames, U. S. Marine Corps (Retired) and SVMPA 1st Vice President, along with James Weibel and James L. Omahen, Commanders of the Sidney VFW and American Legion Posts in Sidney, respectively. The wreath laying ceremony was followed by a 3-Volley Gun Salute by the American Legion Post, and the playing of "Taps" by Cora VanKingsley, Franklin Central High School student.

The ceremony concluded with the band playing "America the Beautiful" as attendees were invited to enter and enjoy their new park.

Since the park dedication SVMPA has been completing

landscape improvements — bringing in more top soil, adding a selection of evergreen and deciduous trees, a rock and shrub ground cover in front of the Victory Wall, and seeding and mulching of the park. The next major fundraising effort will be to raise the funds needed to finish the fencing, which includes six (6) wrought iron sections of fence, as well as, a matching number of bluestone piers and bases. Additional crushed stone and oil is also needed for driveway and parking lot improvements. The fundraising campaign goal for 2016-2017 will approach \$50,000; and, is being planned for presently.

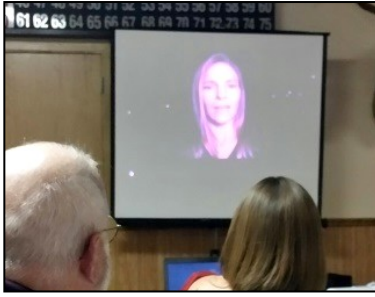

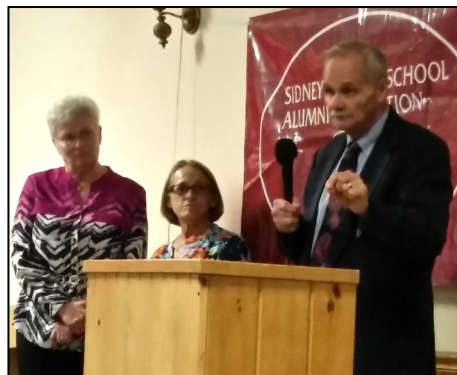

Sidney Warriors athletic history was celebrated in grand style during the 14th annual Sidney Alumni Sports Hall of Fame Induction Dinner and Ceremony held Saturday, October 1 at the Elks Lodge in Sidney. Several changes to the evening were implemented and a last-minute feature was added that evening. Once again, the decorations of Amber Wilson Fogarty '93 wowed the more than 160 attendees. This year, circular tables were put in use to increase family and friends interaction.

The Elks hosted another grand dinner buffet as the centerpiece of the event. Sports Hall of Fame chairman Greg Davie '76 was once again the evening's Master of Ceremonies. And for the second year, the invocation and benediction was delivered by Andy Doyle '96.

Besides the room layout, changes included six inductees instead of the usual four, plus a Legacy team that still holds a school record. Individual inductees were: Claude Shaw '65, Jene Grey '75, David DuMond '88, Erica Peterson Espallat '93, former coach and principal Gary Scavo and the “contributors award” inductees, former Booster Club co-presidents Dale and Nancy Sweet. The 21-0 Boys Basketball team from 1972-73, still the only unbeaten basketball team in the modern era, was honored as the 10th annual Legacy Team.

As has been customary, the inductees hand-picked their introductory speakers. Shaw's choice was teammate and 1964-65 wrestling captain Lonnie Warner '65. For Grey, it was his “little brother” Scott Scavo '95. DuMond's pick was a natural, as younger sister, and 2004 inductee Pam DuMond Tarnowski '92 did the honors repaying Dave for his similar duty upon her induction.

As Gary Scavo was the JV coach that season, it was fitting as he and wife Jackie stayed front and center following a glowing introduction by their son Jene Grey. Then Jeff Sweet '90 entertained the audience with his introduction of his parents Dale and Nancy. Tons of memories and lots of laughs dominated the night and, as usual, it was hard for all to say good bye once the ceremony concluded. Many photos and conversations kept most of the crowd at the Elks for quite some time, confirming the night's success.

There was no charity auction for the first time, since extra inductees meant a longer program. Still, with tremendous support and sponsorships, proceeds will still be applied toward the long-range project to install permanent plaques of all Hall of Fame inductees since its 2003 inception at the high school.

Originally, the induction was held Thanksgiving weekend. By 2007, the Sports Hall of Fame added a Friday night segment to create Induction Weekend. This year, many of the participants were at the Homecoming football game versus Greene, where they were introduced at halftime in front of the home crowd. An alumni reception was held after the game at the VFW.

BIG CHUCK AND 50 SIDNEY ALUMNI TOUR THE GRAND OLD HIGH SCHOOL
On the Saturday of Alumni Week, Chuck D'Imperio (SHS '67) and his brother Bob (SHS '76) conducted a walking tour of Sidney High School. 51 people signed up for the tour. SHS officials graciously opened up the entire school for the walking tour.

It was the first time many had been back to the school since their graduation 10, 20, 30 and even 50 years before. All were amazed at the changes in the school including the new gymnasium, swimming pool and all of the technological advances that have taken place.

There were many laughs and shared memories along the way as Chuck

and Bob guided their guests from the auditorium through the halls and classrooms, into the new library (yes, that was the old gym!) and more. The tour ended with a reception in the cafeteria where cake, punch and ice cream were served to all by members of the entire D'Imperio family, who also are alumni from Sidney High School.

A special tip of the hat goes to Nick Meno (SHS 2015) who accompanied the D'Imperio brothers on the tour. He gave a new, fresh face to the tour and was invaluable in guiding everybody along.

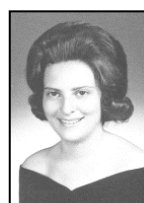

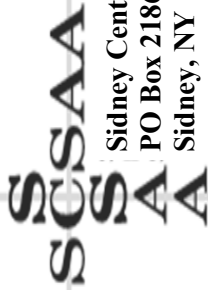
