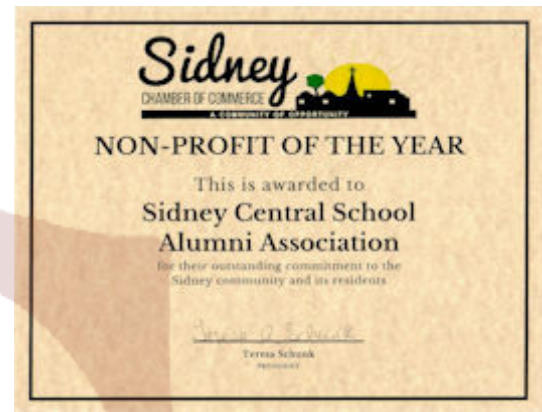

Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2022 Announced

The Sports Hall of Fame committee returned to in-person meetings in February and March and, over the course of four meetings, the next class of inductees was selected.

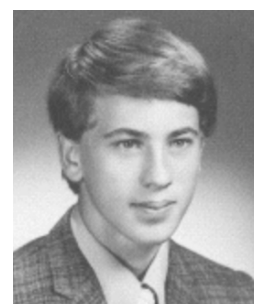
Dates for Induction Weekend were also determined. The two-day celebration will take place Oct. 28-29, with the Friday night varsity football game tradition reinstated. A co-ed alumni soccer game in honor of the coach who instituted soccer at Sidney has been added to the schedule. That game takes place, depending on weather, indoors or outdoors Saturday afternoon.

The Class of 2022:

Twins Don (left) & Ron Henderson, '67: Exceptional in four sports – football, baseball, gymnastics and track. Unique scenario in final season allowed both to play baseball and track. Don passed away in December 1967 of leukemia, enabling us to consider this a single induction for the twins.

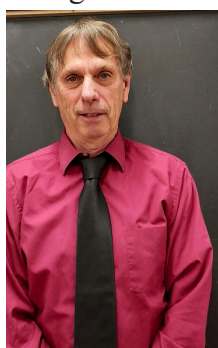


Dr. Don Laird, '73: Football, track, basketball. Part of 21-0 SCS Section IV BB champs (1973) and NAIA Final Four BB team at Campbell University (1977/all-tournament team). Inducted into the Campbell HOF in 1989.



Neal Miley, '98: Heart and soul of 1997-'98 NYS basketball championship team, all-star in football, shot put and discus in track. Played college football at New Haven and Cortland.

Eric Miley, '00 (right): All-time leading scorer in basketball (1551 points), three-time All-NYS selection, two-time Daily Star Player of the Year and excelled in football and volleyball. Played college basketball at Albany and Cazenovia until injuries shut him down.



Coach Steve Hornung: Started boys' soccer from scratch in mid-1980s. Ran concurrent youth program for boys and girls. By his eighth season, he'd coached four straight Section IV finalists (1993-'96), with his 1994 team winning the title. Career (at Sidney) shows 239 wins, including a 13-year stretch of 188-59-12 (76%).

LEGACY: 1989 & 1990 Girls' Cross Country – Coached by Bob Finnegan. Ranked No. 1 NYS Class C most of 1989. That group placed third/1990 team sixth in state meet. Both were also League and Sect. IV Class C team champs.



More details on Induction Weekend will be revealed later this summer. The dinner and induction ceremony are returning to the Elks Lodge Saturday, Oct. 29. Tickets will be available shortly after Alumni Weekend.

This induction event raises money for the annual Sports HOF Scholarship, in its second year. Proceeds also go toward helping maintain the services of the TouchPro monitor system, accessible to students and alumni at the high school and online.

How Alumni Giving Makes a Big Impact

MYTH

I can only give a small amount to SCSAA and it won't make a difference.

Every dollar helps us to do more for the school, community and alumni.

MYTH

My information isn't important to the association.

Out of 7,768 names in our database, we have 3,360 for which we have addresses, and some of them are not correct.

MYTH

My dues will not make a big impact.

Out of those 3,360 addresses, only around 850 are paid members. Dues are our only guaranteed income to help us accomplish our goals.



Here are some of the impacts our association has had on different organizations and incentives:

1. Our alumni association and alumni were able to give over \$50,000 to the Sidney Veterans Memorial Park
2. We buy six yearbooks every year for students who cannot afford to buy one
3. We gave \$2,500 to the library to digitize all the Tri-Town News newspapers
4. We give five scholarships to graduating seniors, two academic awards and one sports scholarships every year
5. We have a Career Day at the high school
6. We send a student to the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards program
7. We helped United Way financially during the 2006 and 2011 floods to help businesses stay afloat
8. We gave over \$12,000 to the Sidney Center Revitalization Project
9. We gave \$10,000 to United Way to help businesses during COVID
10. We pay for the Christmas music that is played over the downtown speakers every year
11. We give four Teen Institute scholarships every year (SADD)

Who Was YOUR Favorite Teacher?

I would have to say that the best high school teacher I ever had was Mrs. Heimer, as she actually got me interested in math. I can't say I was fully committed to getting a good grade, but she did get me thinking. The most recurring memory, after 60-plus years, is of her offer to take me to school instead of me having to walk from upper Camp Street to the old high school. My walk to school was shorter than almost everyone's, albeit my walk home was probably longer than most. Come winter, I offered to plow the Heimers' driveway before school at no charge. I had a cut-down Crosley that was pretty effective at clearing driveways, and it made me feel better about the free rides to school. Jim Tyler, ever the entrepreneur, offered to hand shovel it for \$1 less. Mrs. Heimer called me aside and told this story right after it happened and suggested to Jim that she would be glad to take him up on the offer. She'd like him to pay her \$1 every time he shoveled the driveway. Obviously, she was pretty good at real-life math, as well.

I have to give praise to a teacher whose method and curriculum put me on a path toward better writing and vocabulary. In eighth grade, students who excelled in English could get an early start on foreign languages or take a unique course called "Literature & Composition" - Lit & Comp for short. The Lit & Comp teacher, Gloria Salak, expected much and instilled a passion for language in me. It was grueling to learn 15 vocabulary words each week, yet mastering them expanded my daily word usage. It definitely helped during my career as a radio sports announcer and public speaker. Her assignments in creative writing stretched my limits far beyond where I thought they ended. We had real freedom of expression! Many years later I was able to thank Mrs. Salak in person for sharing her abilities to gently push me each and every day that school year.

Mr. Otis Atkins, my band teacher for eight years, had the most profound and lasting impact on my life. It was he who instilled in me a love and appreciation for the arts, music and drama. The many creative endeavors he originated filled me with pride in our successes and pride as a Sidney student. From standing ovations at our concerts to prize-winning parades, intricate halftime shows, jazz band, private home recitals, new uniforms, theater pit performances and humanities trips, Mr. Atkins gave his all for his students.

The best word to describe Mr. Otis Atkins is: TALENT. Sidney was fortunate to have a music teacher of his caliber; he was top notch. When Mr. Atkins sat at the piano to play "Happy Birthday" to one of his students, it was the most beautiful rendition of the song I had ever heard, before or since. In 1983, Mr. Atkins had the guts to take us on a field trip to Canada. It was an amazing trip and a significant milestone for a smalltown high school student. 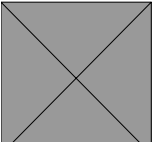
